

## **NEWSLETTER** (September 2019)

Dear Members.

It seems no time at all since the Summer Newsletter was dropping through our mailbox and here we are starting Block 2. You will see from the class timetable that we are re-introducing a second intermediate Art class after lunch. This class had been cancelled earlier this year due to lack of numbers. Unfortunately, the Inspirational Sewing Class did not go ahead in Block 1 for the same reason. It is back on the schedule for Block 2.

For the first time, we will be sending out registration documents to the majority of Haydays members by e-mail according to the preferences you have selected on your Membership form. At the 2018 Christmas lunch we raised £300, which was shared equally between Maggie's Fife and Shelter Scotland. The beneficiaries of monies raised at the 2019 Christmas lunch will be subject to a vote by members. Again, watch the notice board for further information.
